Yesterday on March 12th, 115 cardinals under the age of 80 were closed into the Sistine Chapel in order to elect the new leader of the Catholic Church since the resignation of Pope Benedict XVI on February 28th. They celebrated the special Mass called "Pro Eligendo Romano Pontifice", which represents the beginning of the conclave.

During the afternoon the electors moved into the Sistine Chapel to give their votes to a new "Pontifex". The procedure for election is the following: Every cardinal writes the name of his preferred cardinal on a piece of paper and put it into a ballot box. When votes are counted, the pieces are burned in a small oven with one chemical substance. The latter is chosen according to the results of the vote. When the next pope is elected, the substance which turns smoke into white is chosen. When no majority is reached, the substance chosen turns smoke into dark grey. The colour of the smoke coming out of the small chimney on the roof of the Sistine Chapel can be seen from the people on the Piazza San Pietro through a Experts are very excited about what is going to happen in the conclave. Kim Jong Un announces military target in South Korea



The dictator of North Korea spoke for the first time in this conflict of a determined target. The first strike is announced

on military facilities on a small island near the borderline between South and North Korea. The five thousand inhabitants of Baengnyong are "a bit afraid". Another cause of concern for many people in South Korea is that North Korea has once again terminated the non-aggression-pact. This is the twelfth time in the last 20 years.

Traveling chaos in northern Europe

Because of heavy snowfall in Northern Europe, Frankfurt airport and Charles de Gaulle airport have cancelled numerous flights. The Eurostar high speed railways between France and England have also been affected. As a matter of fact, more than three hundred car accidents were counted in Surrey (an English town) yesterday.

Tense athmosphere






