In collabo-ration with the Alpine Convention and the Permanent secretariat a model of the youth parliament was born. As a simulation of a proper parliament, it offers secondary school students an opportunity to discuss and suggest sustainable solution to current issues of concern in the Alpine region, as well as provides a chance for exchanging different opinions and experiences, along with establishing new friendships. The topic of this year's event taking place between 16th and 20th March 2015 at Rudolf Maister Grammar and Vocational school Kamnik.is Ecosystem services in times of climate change, within which the committees will be discussing the following subthemes: Soil, Food production and waste assimilation, Importance of forests as the source of renewable energy, Recreation and the cultural aspects of ecosystems.

2015 is the International Year of Soil, to make us remember how important soil is for our lives. Without it the people could not exist, because there has to be soil in order to have plants, animals and people in the world.

This is the reason why it is also a topic in one of the committees at this year's YPAC session, which takes place under the umbrella topic Ecosystem Services in Times of Climate Change. Especially in the Alpine region we have to take care of the soil, because it is very vulnerable and there can arise big problems.

The committee, which works with the topic, will deal with different questions and problems like interventions in the environment in the Alps. For example ski resorts and their impact on the soil by bulldozing ski slopes or if people can build on their land even when the government forbids it. There are often clashes between the interests of different people or groups and it is important to work out a solution which is a good middle course and fits everybody.





Food production and waste assimilation Anna Strutz, Austria

The production of food proportional to the amount of waste has always been an important theme. Therefore the topic of committee 2 is food production and waste assimilation.

First there will be a discussion about the maintenance of mountain farming, because without state subsidies this will not be possible any longer. The next point will be combined farming, if this is a good option or not.

Then there is the difficulty about transportation of locally grown food if it is really necessary to transport it to somewhere far away and not just sell it in the region where it has been growing, what is contingent on a high carbon dioxide emission.

Next will be a discussion about the harm of genetically modified organisms and how people exploit the local species of animals. Subsequently the discussion will go on about waste processing, because loads of energy is need there. Thus the question of bestowing the waste to other more agile regions beyond alpine regions and paying other people for processing, poses at this point.

Finally there is the issue of passing a law determining the number of package layers.



Importance of forests as the source of renewable energy Laurie Jacot, Chamonix

The guiding line of this committee is to

assess the value of the forest resources

in the countries of the Alpine convention. Human populations don't only benefit from forests, they depend on them. As theyprovide materials and food and represent a significant source of energy, forests must be considered in a sustainable reasoning, especially because they're renewable if they'reexploited the right way. The committee will have to debate about the use of this resource while keeping inmind the various issues linked to it. For instance, they're likely to discuss which mean of energy production is more beneficial for alpine countries between biomass and hydro-power. Another topic to broach is whether we should preserve forests for their ecological value or exploit them for their economic value. Choosing implies dealing with new problems but the aim of a committee is to suggest solutions. Our representatives will have to find one that is as close as possible tothe golden mean between sustainability, economy and sociology. Committee 3 has been tasked to deal with the different aspects of the use offorests, one of the main issues for the alpine arc as trees cover most of our land.



Recreation and the cultural aspects of ecosystems Maruša Terzič, Maribor

The goal of our committee's work is to analyse the opportunities for recreational and non-commercial use of ecosystems in Alpine region.

We will start by educating ourselves about the use of ecosystems in various fields.

Furthermore we will focus on the recreational activities, such as fishing and eco-tourism, discussing how we can utilize our ecosystem to contribute to people's recreational requirements and how we already benefit from it.

In the next part, we will examine the noncommercial or cultural use of ecosystems, which means exploiting their artistic, aesthetic, educational, spiritual, and scientific values. All those will be presented separately.

Similarly to the study done on the recreational purpose, we will elaborate on the existent, as well as the possible forthcoming opportunities for cultural value of ecosystems.

Our analysis will primarily focus on the future and how we can exploit the possibilities the ecosystems offer even further. Our wish is to provide a different approach to the utilization of ecosystems.
